The ministry of tourism has created Indian Institution of Travel and Tourism management (IITTM) in 1983 in New Delhi. After IITTM many other universities in India started various tourism courses. many courses like Travel & Tourism Management, Hotel Management, Cargo Management, Airline Ticketing and various other diploma & Certificate courses have been offered across the country. The famous tourism institutes are Pondicherry University, Banaras Hindu University, Bundelkhand University, HNB Garhwal University, HP Central University, Lucknow University, Kurukshetra University, Tezpur University, Christ University, Indira Gandhi Tribal University-Amarkantak, Madurai Kamraj University and many other government and private Institutions.
